LESSON: Luke 6:36-42

36 Be merciful, just as your Father is merciful. **37** 'Do not judge, and you will not be judged; do not condemn, and you will not be condemned. Forgive, and you will be forgiven; **38** give, and it will be given to you. A good measure, pressed down, shaken together, running over, will be put into your lap; for the measure you give will be the measure you get back.' **39** He also told them a parable: 'Can a blind person guide a blind person? Will not both fall into a pit? **40** A disciple is not above the teacher, but everyone who is fully qualified will be like the teacher. **41** Why do you see the speck in your neighbour's eye, but do not notice the log in your own eye? **42** Or how can you say to your neighbour, "Friend, let me take out the speck in your eye", when you yourself do not see the log in your own eye? 
