## **THE CELEBRATION OF BAPTISM**

### **Thanksgiving over the Water**

The Lord be with you.

***People* And also with you.**

*Celebrant* Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

***People* It is right to give our thanks and praise.**

*Celebrant* We thank you, Almighty God, for the gift of water. Over water the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation. Through water you led the children of Israel out of their bondage in Egypt into the land of promise. In water your Son Jesus received the baptism of John and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah, the Christ, to lead us, through his death and resurrection, from the bondage of sin into everlasting life.

We thank you, Father, for the water of baptism. In it we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection. Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit. Therefore in joyful obedience to your Son, we bring into his fellowship those who come to him in faith, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Now sanctify this water by the power of your Holy Spirit, that those who are here cleansed from sin and born again, may continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Saviour. To him, to you, and to the Holy Spirit, be all honour and glory, now and for ever. **Amen.**

Let us join with those who are committing themselves to Christ and renew our own baptismal covenant.

### **The Baptismal Covenant**

*Celebrant* Do you believe in God the Father?

***People* I believe in God, The Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.**

*Celebrant* Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. **People I believe in God the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.**

*Celebrant* Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers?

**People I will, with God's help.**

*Celebrant* Will you persevere in resisting evil and, whenever you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord?

**People I will, with God's help.**

*Celebrant* Will you proclaim by word and example the good news of God in Christ?

**People I will, with God's help.**

*Celebrant* Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbour as yourself?

**People I will, with God's help.**

*Celebrant* Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being?

**People I will, with God's help.**

*Celebrant* Will you strive to safeguard the integrity of God's creation, and respect, sustain and renew the life of the Earth?

**People I will, with God's help.**

*Celebrant* Will you strive to safeguard the integrity of God's creation, and respect, sustain and renew the life of the Earth?

**People I will, with God's help.**

## **The Baptism**

Spencer, I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

**Amen.**

I sign you with the cross, and mark you as Christ's own for ever.

Heavenly Father, we thank you that by water and the Holy Spirit you have bestowed upon these your servants the forgiveness of sin, and have raised them to the new life of grace. Sustain them, O Lord, in your Holy Spirit. Give them an inquiring and discerning heart, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and to love you, and the gift of joy and wonder in all your works. **Amen.**

## **The Giving of the Light**

Receive the light of Christ, to show that you have passed from darkness to light.

**People Let your light so shine before others that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven.**

*Priest Bishop Helen*, I present unto you these persons to receive the laying on of hands.

*Bishop* Take heed that these persons whom ye present be duly prepared and meet to receive the laying on of hands.

*Priest* I have instructed them and inquired of them and believe them so to be.

## **PREFACE**

*Bishop* Friends, these are they to whom we purpose, God willing, to administer the Apostolic rite of the laying on of hands. The Church has thought good to order that none shall be confirmed, but such as can say the Creed, the Lord's Prayer, and the Ten Commandments, and are further instructed in the Church Catechism, set forth for that purpose. We are assured that these persons present, being by baptism members of Christ's Church, are prepared as aforesaid, and we are assembled here to bless them by the laying on of hands with prayer. This order is very convenient to be observed. First. Because it is evident from sundry places in holy Scripture that the Apostles prayed for and laid their hands upon those who were baptized; and the same is agreeable with the usage of the Church since the Apostles' time. This holy rite is reckoned in the Epistle to the Hebrews to be one of the first principles of Christ. Secondly. In order that persons, having come to the years of discretion, may acknowledge openly the vows made at their Baptism and dedicate their lives to the will of God.

Thirdly. In order that by prayer and laying on of hands they may be strengthened by the Holy Spirit, confidently to fight under the banner of Christ crucified, against sin, the world, and the devil, and to continue Christ's faithful soldiers and servants unto their life's end.

*Then the Bishop, or someone appointed by her, shall read the following:*

Hear the words of holy Scripture written in the nineteenth chapter of the Acts of the Apostles, beginning at the first verse:

And it came to pass, that, while Apollos was at Corinth, Paul having passed through the upper country came to Ephesus, and found certain disciples: and he said unto them, Did ye receive the Holy Spirit when ye believed? And they said unto him, Nay, we did

not so much as hear whether the Holy Spirit was given. And he said, Into what then were ye baptized? And they said, Into John's baptism. And Paul said, John baptized with the baptism of repentance, saying unto the people, that they should believe on him which should come after him, that is, on Jesus. And when they heard this, they were baptized into the name of the Lord Jesus. And when Paul had laid his hands upon them, the Holy Spirit came on them; and they spake with tongues, and prophesied. And they were in all about twelve men.

*The Bishop shall then require the RENEWAL OF BAPTISMAL VOWS, saying:*

*Bishop* Do you here, in the presence of God and of this Congregation, renounce the devil and all his works, the pomps and vanity of this wicked world, and all the sinful lusts of the flesh?

*Confirmands* **I do.**

*Bishop* Do you believe the Christian Faith as it is set forth in the Apostles' Creed?

*Confirmands* **I do.**

*Bishop* Will you endeavour to keep God's holy will and commandments, and to walk in the same all the days of your life?

*Confirmands* **I do.**

Then shall the Bishop proceed with the CONFIRMATION, commending those who are to be confirmed to the prayers of the Congregation. and saying:

Our help is in the Name of the Lord;  
All **Who hath made heaven and earth.**

*Bishop* Blessed be the Name of the Lord;  
All **Henceforth, world without end.**

*Bishop* Lord, hear our prayer;  
All And **let our cry come unto thee.**

*Bishop* Let us pray.

ALMIGHTY and everliving God, who hast vouchsafed to regenerate these thy servants by Water and the Holy Spirit, and hast given unto them forgiveness of all their sins: Confirm and strengthen them, we beseech thee, O Lord, with the Holy Spirit the Comforter, and daily increase in them thy manifold gifts of grace; the spirit of wisdom and understanding; the spirit of counsel and might; the spirit of knowledge and true godliness; and fill them, O Lord, with the spirit of thy holy fear, now and for ever. **Amen.**

*Then all of them in order kneeling (or standing) before the Bishop, she shall lay her hands upon the head of every one severally, saying: Kellianne and Spencer*

DEFEND, O Lord, this thy Servant with thy heavenly grace, they may continue thine for ever; and daily increase in thy Holy Spirit, more and more, until he/she/they come unto thy everlasting kingdom. **Amen.**

*Then shall the Bishop say:*  
The Lord be with you;  
**All And with thy spirit.**

*Bishop* Let us pray.

ALMIGHTY and everliving God, who makest us both to will and to do such things as be good and acceptable unto thy Divine Majesty: We make our humble supplications unto thee for these thy servants, upon whom, after the example of thy holy Apostles, we have now laid our hands, to certify them, by this sign, of thy favour and gracious goodness towards them. Let thy fatherly hand, we beseech thee, ever be over them; let thy Holy Spirit ever be with them; and so lead them in the knowledge and obedience of thy Word, that in the end they may obtain everlasting life; through our Lord Jesus Christ, who with thee and the Holy Ghost liveth and reigneth, ever one God, world without end. **Amen.**

Worthy is the Lamb that was slain to receive power, and riches, and wisdom, and strength, and honour, and glory, and blessing.

**COFFEE HOST MINISTRY – VOLUNTEERS NEEDED** Yvonne and Christian Schmidt are retiring from the first Sunday of each month Coffee preparation, serving and clean-up. We thank them for their faithful service!

Eileen Barrie (co-ordinator) is looking for two volunteers to fill this vacancy.

On the first Sunday of each month, the Coffee Hosts’ duties are to:

- Arrive at 10:00 a.m. before the Morning Service. (The tables and chairs are usually set up by secret angels.)
- Prepare the beverages (coffee, tea, cream, milk, sugar, boiled water, juice, powdered mixes).
- Cover the tables with green plastic tablecloths.
- Make up plates of cookies.
- Turn on the dishwasher.

After the Morning Service, host the serving of beverages.

After the social time:

- Clean the tables
- Run the dishwasher
- Put away mugs and glasses
- Tidy the kitchen
- Take home the dish towel to launder and return
